

## USING MULTIPLE CSS FILES

- » Why use multiple CSS files?
  - » To avoid any redundant code!
- » Recommended Approaches:
  - » For small sites, either use:
    - » One large CSS file
      - » You will probably need to use some unique ID's on each page
      - » Example: universal.css
    - » One universal CSS file plus several page-specific CSS files
      - » Example: universal.css, pagex.css, pagey.css, pagez.css
  - » For large, complex sites
    - » Multiple CSS files
      - » Example: universal.css, home.css, sub.css, pagex.css, pagey.css, pagez.css


# SINGLE CSS

FOR SMALL WEB SITES




# REDUNDANT CSS

NOT RECOMMENDED!




# UNIV CSS + PAGE SPECIFIC CSS
