LOW-INCOME RESIDENTS TO GET FREE TAX PREP ASSISTANCE FROM UH WEST O'AHU STUDENT VOLUNTEERS

PEARL CITY --- As the filing deadline draws near, UH West Oʻahu (UHWO) student volunteers will offer free assistance for low-income taxpayers with federal and state tax returns in partnership with Volunteer Legal Services Hawaiʻi, a non-profit organization that provides free or low-cost legal services to low-income residents. At tax preparation workshops across Oʻahu, UHWO students will provide a valuable service to the community.

All volunteers have been trained and certified to prepare basic tax forms not including returns for self-employed taxpayers or those with a rental income. Since February, UH West Oʻahu students have provided tax assistance for Hawaiʻi families as part of the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program, a cooperative partnership between the Internal Revenue Service and the State of Hawaiʻi.

"Over a decade ago, we incorporated the VITA program as a key part of the learning experience for students in tax classes at UH West Oʻahu," says UHWO Accounting Lecturer Wayne Tanna. "I utilize the service-learning experience as a way to make the subject of taxation applicable to the world outside the classroom. I truly believe this experience transforms not just the community but also the students themselves."
