WEST O'AHU DAY FESTIVITIES HIGHLIGHT UH WEST O'AHU STUDENT TALENT

PEARL CITY --- UH West Oʻahu (UHWO) students, faculty and staff recently celebrated West Oʻahu Day at the university's campus courtyard. Featuring raffle prize-giveaways, student club activities, live entertainment by 7 Positive Minds and more, the event was a collaboration of the entire UHWO community.

A student talent show headlined the day's festivities hosted by KCCN FM 100's Lina Girl. The talent show offered the best of UH West O'ahu and featured vocal, dance, and comedy performances that delighted cheering on-lookers.

UHWO senior Bueno Chen, a Pearl City resident, took home the third place prize for his Spanish rendition of "Every Breath You Take," while second place went to senior and Mililani resident Aaron Gorospe, who dazzled the audience with a piano and vocal performance of "His Eye is on the Sparrow." All first, second and third place winners were awarded with gift cards from Best Buy.

In addition to the student talent show, the West Oʻahu day event featured activity booths hosted by UHWO student clubs as well as organizations including the Institute of Human Rights Hawaiʻi, UH Federal Credit Union and the Hawaiʻi Foodbank. UH West Oʻahu representatives collected donations on-site to support the Foodbank's annual food drive.

During the festivities, Psychology Club member Bueno Chen presented UH West Oʻahu Chancellor Gene Awakuni with a \$200 donation to the Barbara Newton Memorial Scholarship Fund. The scholarship was established in 1996 in memory of Dr. Barbara Newton, one of the founding faculty members of the psychology program at UHWO.
