COMMENCEMENT CEREMONY FOR UH WEST O'AHU SATURDAY, MAY 12, 5 P.M., NEAL S. BLAISDELL CONCERT HALL

PEARL CITY --- This Saturday, May 12, is a special day for 155 University of Hawai'i - West O'ahu graduates who will receive their degrees and certificates during commencement ceremonies at the Neal S. Blaisdell Concert Hall in Honolulu. This commencement ceremony marks UH West O'ahu's last to be held at an off campus location prior to the University's move to its brand new Kapolei campus in August.

UH West Oʻahu graduates will receive their baccalaureate in Applied Sciences, Business Administration, Education, Humanities, Public Administration and Social Sciences. Graduates will also receive certificates in various programs including Applied Forensic Anthropology, Disaster Preparedness and Emergency Management, Health Care Administration, and Substance Abuse and Addictions Studies.

University of Hawai'i System Vice President of Capital Improvements Brian Minaai will attend and University of Hawai'i Board of Regents' Chuck Gee will address the graduates. Cheryl Ann Natividad, one of this year's outstanding UH West O'ahu graduates, will speak on behalf of the graduating class.

Cheryl is an elementary education major and recently completed her senior semester teaching first grade students at Waipahu Elementary School. She received the ETS Recognition of Excellence Award for achieving high scores on the Praxis II: Elementary Education Content Knowledge exam and is a member of the UH West Oʻahu Dean's list. Cheryl worked as a research assistant for the UH West Oʻahu Honouliuli Internment and POW Camp Project and as a part-time teacher and tutor for English Language Learners. She enjoys spending time with her husband and two sons and looks forward to teaching at a Hawaiʻi elementary school and working toward a master's degree in Education following graduation.

Commencement tickets will be distributed to graduates and are required for guest admission to the Concert Hall. Doors will open at 4:30 p.m. to ticket holders only and the ceremony begins promptly at 5 p.m. No strollers, tripods or balloons are allowed. Graduates will greet guests after the ceremony at the lawn on the corner of Ward Avenue and King Street at 6 p.m. Parking is available at the Neal S. Blaisdell parking structure for a \$6 fee. Nearby street parking is free.
