UNIVERSITY OF HAWAI'I ARTICULATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN KAPI'OLANI COMMUNITY COLLEGE AND CHAMINADE UNIVERSITY OF HONOLULU

This agreement was developed to allow students studying for the Associate of Science Educational Paraprofessionals-Special Education Emphasis at Kapi'olani Community College to have certain courses at Kapi'olani Community College apply toward meeting established degree and/or certificate requirements at Chaminade University of Honolulu. It establishes guidelines for the transfer of students and the transfer of academic credit between the two institutions. While other agreements may exist between the two institutions, the courses discussed in this document are specific to education (ED) courses only.

Articulation is undertaken for the benefit of students who desire to transfer between our respective institutions in order to meet their educational objectives. The objectives of the articulation are to assure that the transfer student is prepared for work at the new campus, that a degree or certificate earned through matriculation at two or more institutions is comparable to a degree earned through matriculation at a single campus and that the transfer process works smoothly for the student.

The curricula of our respective institutions are not only a reflection of a wide variety of programs of study; but also mirror the knowledge skills, interest, and educational philosophy of the faculty, staff and administration. The established curricula are not static entities, but rather are constantly being refined and changed. Unless special provisions are made to accommodate students, these changes can prove to be a formidable barrier to the smooth transfer of students from one campus to another.

To facilitate transfer of students between the two institutions, Chaminade University agrees to accept transfer credit for the following courses equivalencies effective Fall 2008:

The following provisions apply to the forgoing grid of course equivalences:

- 1. Only credits earned with a "B"* or better will transfer, the grade of CR transfers insofar as it continues to reflect B or better work in a course taken on the credit/no credit option.
 - * Students in the Education Program at Chaminade must have a grade of "B" or better in all Education courses.
- 2. The student's grade point ratio (GPR) is not transferable to Chaminade University.
- 3. Lower division courses substituted for upper division courses do not count towards the required 45 upper division units to graduate.
- 4. **ED 404 includes a "Signature Assignment" that is integral to the Elem Ed licensure program. Students need to complete and pass this "Signature Assignment" even if they have received transfer credit for the course. The "Signature Assignments" is due at the same time they are due for the regularly scheduled classes.

This articulation agreement will remain in effect until July 1, 2010. It will be subject to review at that time and may be continued, revised, or discontinued with the consent of both parties.
