At KCC we honor our past by striving for excellence in everything we do.

- Kapi`olani Community College was founded in 1946 as Kapi`olani Technical School and joined the University of Hawai'i system in 1965.
- With pride & responsibility, Kapi`olani Community College has assumed the Queen's name and motto, i.e., *Kulia i ka Nu`u*, "strive for the highest,". The challenge of the College is to perpetuate that *heritage of excellence*.



KCC - Vision Statement



- Who are our students?

• Enrollment is approximately **7,955** students including students from 35 countries.

ксс - Celebrating Our Present

- 37% of our students attend full-time.
- 58% of KCC's students are women; mean age 25 years.
- 51% of students report their ethnicity as Asian, 14% Hawaiian/ Pacific Islander, 13% Caucasian, 17% mixed, and 3% other.

- KCC's Business Education programs prepare students for entry- and mid-level positions in business, transfer to four-year baccalaureate degree institutions, and skill upgrading for professionals in the field.

KCC – Culinary Arts


- This American Culinary Federation-accredited program (recently re-accredited for the maximum 5 year period) continues its strong tradition and leadership in providing Hawai'i and the world with skilled culinarians knowledgeable in Asian and Western cuisines, and state-of-the-art pastry arts.
- Students earn Associate Degree and Certificates in Culinary Arts, Dining Room Service and Patisserie.
- The students in KCC's nationally an internationally renown Culinary Arts Program served 554,073 customers in fiscal year 2005 2006.





KCC - Hospitality: Travel & Tourism, Hotel & Restaurant Operations

- The Associate Degree and Certificate programs in Hotel/Restaurant Operations and Management and in Travel and Tourism Operations and Management prepare students with the knowledge, attitudes and practical skills necessary for job careers in Hawai`i's Hospitality Industry, as well as to transfer to four-year colleges and universities.
- The Commission on Accreditation of Hospitality Management Programs (CAHM) has *re-accredited* our Hotel Operations/ Management and Travel & Tourism Operations and Management Programs for another *7 year* period.
 - KCC is the only one of 12 Community Colleges receiving CAHM accreditation.







ксс - Health Careers Education

- KCC offers Associate Degree and Certificates in:
 - Emergency Medical Technician (EMT-I) Program
 - Mobile Intensive Care
 Technician (MICT) Program
 - First Responder training for Public Safety Officers, e.g., Police, Lifeguards, and Firefighters, etc.



 KCC's EMS programs prepare students to provide basic and advanced life support to patients in the pre-hospital emergency care setting statewide.

- Long Term Care (LTC) Nurse Aide



Celebrating Our Present: Student Learning Outcomes

- Student Learning Outcomes attained in part by the external validation of national licensure & credentialing exams, e.g.,
 - EMT and MICT 100% pass rate over the last 7 years
 - 100% pass rate in exams for Medical Lab registry or certification; Occupational Therapy Assistance certification; Physical Therapist Assistant licensure; Radiologic Technician registry; and Respiratory Therapy exam.
 - 94.4% pass rate in the Medical Assisting AAMA certification exam
 - 100% pass rate in our Continuing Education/Workforce Development Programs for Pharmacy Technician and Massage Therapy on certification board exam and/or state licensure exam.






ксс - Liberal Arts

 The Associate in Arts (AA) in Liberal Arts and Associate Degree in Natural Sciences (ASNS) prepare students for transfer to four-year colleges and universities.









ксс - Liberal Arts

- Within the AA degree students may *concentrate* in:
 - Art,
 - Business,
 - Education,
 - Engineering,
 - Information and Computer Sciences,
 - Psychology,
 - Life Sciences,
 - Physical Sciences,
 - Asian Studies, or
 - Hawaiian Language & Hawaiian Studies





 Over the year, KCC has added degree options within Liberal Arts

The **New Media Arts Program** offers an Associate in Science degree in three specializations.

The NMA students' film "Toilet Story" won the top award, Platinum, at the Hawai`i Film Festival and \$500. It also won the Grand Prize for Video on ourstage.com and \$5,000. These students have already been contacted for possible production work.

KCC - Science, Technology, Engineering, & Mathematics

- KCC was awarded a \$1.25 million and a \$500,00 grant to promote and develop a Science Technology Engineering Mathematics (STEM) program for the purpose of enhancing opportunities for Native Hawaiian and other underrepresented students to pursue careers in these fields.
- With this support KCC has established
 - A STEM Center
 - Summer Bridge Program, and
 - AS Degree in Natural Sciences (ASNS) with concentration in Life Science or Physical Science with credits transferable to a four-year institution.





Celebrating Our Present: Student Learning Outcomes

- Continuing enrollment and transfer studies document that KCC graduates had the highest average completion rate (77%) in achieving a six-year baccalaureate degree of any campus in the seven campus UH Community College system; also
- Studies show that students from KCC and the other UHCC campuses who transfer to UH at Mānoa, having earned an AA degree, *perform as well as or better* than students who enrolled as first-time, first-year students at UHM.





KCC Partnerships - Department of Education

- DOE partnerships include:
 - Running Start Juniors and seniors attending Hawaii's public schools have the opportunity to enroll in college courses in the UH system as part of their high school coursework and earn both high school and college credits through the Running Start Program.



- Last year <u>96 percent</u> (661 of 691) of Running Start students passed college courses and received both high school and college credit.
- Educational Paraprofessionals, e.g., Special Needs – deaf/hard of hearing, interpreting and ESL



KCC Partnerships - UH System

- Presently UH system partnerships include:
 - Radiologic Technology program at Maui Community College
 - Bachelor's in Applied Science (BAS) in Respiratory Care with UH West Oahu
 - Emergency Preparedness Grant-EMS Terrorism Emergency Response





 Honda International Center (HIC) supports UHCC system-wide in International Enrollment Management, Study Abroad Customized Contract Training, & International Exchange Agreements.

KCC Partnerships - UH System

- Future UH system partnerships include:
 - Ka`ie`ie a dual admission - dual enrollment degree pathway program with UH Manoa.
 - BAS in Culinary Arts & Management with UH-West Oahu.



KCC Partnerships - Community

- Presently community partnerships include:
 - The Waianae Coast Comprehensive Health Care - Waianae Health
 Academy Health Education programs – Nursing, OTA, Med Assistant,
 Community Heath Worker



- RN Preparation Program for *Filipino Nurses Project*
- Gallaudet University Regional Center
 provides support and services in support of Hawai`i and the Pacific Basin deaf community.



KCC Partnerships - Community

- Other community partnerships include:
 - Palolo Community Work with the Palolo community to develop and establish the "Bridging the Digital Divide" initiative bringing 21st century technology opportunities to the parents and children of Palolo Valley since 1999.



- In August 2007, the College received \$800,000 from the Office of University Partnerships at U.S. Housing and Urban Development to create a @ 5,000 square foot Ohana Learning Center at Palolo Homes.
- The Nurse Education Satellite Program KCC nursing programs will be offered for underrepresented groups in Leeward (LCC - Fall '07) Waianae (Fall '08), & Windward (WCC, Spring '09.)





- Explore & explain, given the present efforts, the additional future space needs of the College.




Develop a *comprehensive plan* that guides the physical development such as the location of buildings, open space, circulation, and other land uses.

- Implementation of the consolidation of the Office of Community and Continuing Education
