PURPOSE:

To garner formal approval from the Board of Regents for the Kapi'olani Community College mission statement in preparation for 2012 Self Study.

BACKGROUND:

Accreditation Standard I: Institutional Effectiveness and Mission, states that

"The mission statement is approved by the governing board and published."

ACTION RECOMMENDED:

Review of Kapi'olani Community College Mission Statement:

The 2003-2010 and 2009-2015 Mission Statements are attached. The latter has new language highlighted in bold.

Statement 1 explicitly recognizes the importance of "pedagogy, and support services and activities" in supporting Hawaii's cultural diversity.

Statement 2 explicitly highlights the need to improve college-wide communication as recommended in our 2006 Self Study Report. It also highlights the need for a more mission-driven institution that will need a greater emphasis on shared responsibilities to achieve ambitious strategies outcomes.

Statement 3 is a minor and preferred rewording.

Statement 4 has no changes.

Statement 5 places greater emphasis on students' preparation for a rigorous associate degree, and the importance of improved articulation and transfer.

Statement 6 is greatly revised as we recognize our urgent responsibilities to both meet current workforce needs and to support a diversifying, knowledge-intensive and sustainable economy.

Statement 7 is a minor rewording that highlights our service-learning and community engagement efforts.

Statement 8 is a minor rewording that highlights enriched global collaborations.

Statement 9 aligns with our intentional efforts to provide a solid return on the public's investments, and greater efforts to attract external resources into the state.

Statement 10 places greater emphasis on lifelong learning through targeted academic programs and strengthened continuing education,.

Statement 11 integrates a more holistic approach to all the cyclical processes involved in institutional improvement.
