Significant Findings:

- 1) There was a net decrease of student enrollments from Fall 16 to Fall 17 (-287). There was a net loss of 178 female students and 138 male students. This constitutes 4% of the female population and 4.6% of the male population from the Fall 2016 Enrollment figure.
- 2) There were also significant drop-offs in the 20-21 and 22-24 year old populations. There was a net decrease of 94 students in the 20-21 year old demographic and 128 students in the 22-24 year old population.
- 3) When looking at enrollment numbers of Filipino students, Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander Students, there were no significant drops in these numbers when comparing to the Fall 2016 numbers.
- 4) When looking at Full-time/Part-time status, 3/4ths of the students enrolled in Fall 17 are part time students. This pattern has not changed from Fall 16.
- 5) The mean SSH remained virtually the same between Fall 2016 and Fall 2017.
- 6) When looking at Citizenship status, there was not much change in the number of non-U.S. citizens enrolled at KapCC between Fall 2016 and Fall 2017. 2017 had a net loss of 19 students, this constitutes 2.7% of the Non-Citizen population of 2016. When looking at the Resident alien populations of both Fall 2016 and 2017, 2017 had a net decrease of 71 Resident alien enrollments. This constitutes a net loss of 9.9% of this population.
- 7) When looking at the majors of KapCC students, and comparing these majors to Fall 2016, There were no changes in the order of the top 6 majors. When looking at the 7th most popular major in 2017 it was Special Early admit students. In 2016 the 7th most popular major was accounting.
